Dear Ms. Doyle:

We are writing on behalf of the Regeneration Project of the New Bedford Economic Development Council in support of the New Bedford Port Authority's waterways license application for restaurant use in the small shed on Pier 3. The Regeneration Project Committee is a collaborative platform that represents nearly 40 community, institutional, and business leaders who are committed to shaping, advocating for, and tangibly advancing strategies for sustainable and shared growth for the City of New Bedford and the region.

In our 2018 report, *Realizing the Potential*, we outline four "big ideas" to drive local, sustainable, and equitable economic growth in New Bedford. One of those big ideas is to build a vibrant, diverse, and uniquely New Bedford downtown and waterfront experience for all. This use directly advances the specific goal to strengthen New Bedford as a "food destination" with unique cultural flair. Small venues such as this are critical to showcasing the New Bedford fishing industry to citizens and visitors alike, while the commercial fishing vessels serve as a real-world reminder of what it takes to get that food to your plate. We also wish to note that such uses, in limited scope such as this, have been envisioned in the central waterfront in the stakeholder driven Urban Planning work completed by the City and Port Authority that has been approved by the Planning Board and is now before the City Council.

This use is compatible, small in scale at just over 200 sq. ft., and does not interfere with existing maritime uses on the pier given the scale of the pier and the existing year-round restaurant use already in place. We have seen since its opening that this popular venue is a driver of safe public access to the waterfront with local fishermen being counted amongst the many customers (and even suppliers) to the restaurant. Not only is this adaptive re-use of a simple shed a great way to positively brand and promote our national leading working waterfront, but it also employs 20 people during its open season, and financially helps to support the Designated Port Area (DPA) by lease payments to the Port Authority.

DEP regulations do allow for Supporting Uses in DPAs. This restaurant is one of those uses, and we encourage the Department to make that determination and issue the license as soon as practical. We thank you for the opportunity to provide comment.
